Foxlake Dundee

Arbroath Abbey

Founded by William the Lion in 1178, in memory of martyr Thomas Becket, the abbey remained one of the nation's grandest monasteries for almost 400 years. Much later, the Stone of Destiny had a starring role in Arbroath Abbey's story. Arbroath Abbey is best known for the Declaration of Arbroath, the most famous document in Scottish history was a letter to Pope John XXII sent by 39 Scottish nobles, barons and freemen in response to the renewed excommunication of Robert the Bruce.

Glen Tanar Estate

Stretching across 25,000 acres of Caledonian pine forests, heather-clad hills and fertile farmland, Glen Tanar Estate is situated in Royal Deeside. Home to Scotland's most easterly Munro, Mount Keen, as well as the tumbling Water of Tanar and the River Dee, Glen Tanar is in the east of the Cairngorms National Park and includes a large National Nature Reserve. There are several Estate activities such as hill walking, mountain biking, fishing and Estate Safaris. The hike will last about an hour with a refreshment stop. It will cover the main areas of the estate and the different activities available.

Fyvie Castle

This magnificent fortress in the heart of Aberdeenshire is a sterling example of Scottish Baronial architecture. Inside, the rooms are filled with antiquities, armour and lavish oil paintings. Out in the grounds the grandeur continues, with a picturesque loch and an unusual glass-roofed racquets court. Ghosts, legends and folklore are all woven into the tapestry of Fyvie's 800-year-old history, but stories aside, we do know William the Lion was at Fyvie around 1214 and later Robert the Bruce and Charles I were among its royal guests.
