Mull of Galloway

Your client can climb the **115 steps of Scotland's most Southerly Lighthouse** for some of the best views in South West Scotland. Your client can explore the Lighthouse Exhibition and learn about life as a Lighthouse Keeper. The Mull of Galloway Lighthouse is perched on the edge of a 260 ft. **high cliff at Scotland's most Southerly Point. It was built by Robert Stevenson, with work commencing in 1828 and taking two years to complete.** The light, which stands 99 m above sea level, was first lit on the 26th March 1830. The light remains operational today.
