The award-winning New Lanark Visitor Centre tells the fascinating story of the cotton mill village of New Lanark which was founded in the 18th century and declared UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2001. New Lanark quickly became known under the enlightened management of social pioneer, Robert Owen. He provided decent homes, fair wages, free health care, a new education system for villagers and the first workplace nursery school in the world!

Glenkinchie Distillery

Glenkinchie Distillery was founded in 1837 when at least 115 licensed distilleries were recorded in the lowlands, though their products would probably not pass muster today! The distillery offers a daily transport service direct to the distillery from Edinburgh City Centre, the bus operates 7 days a week and departs at 10.00 and 13.30.

Floors Castle

Built by leading architect William Adam between 1721-1726 for the 1st Duke of Roxburghe, Floors Castle has undergone periodic changes to create the dramatic building you see today, notably during the Victorian period through the work of Scottish architect William Playfair. This magnificent family seat is the largest inhabited house in Scotland and has been home to ten generations of the Dukes of Roxburghe.

Abbotsford House



Abbotsford House is the ancestral home of Sir Walter Scott, the 19th century novelist, poet and historian. Sir Walter Scott's Abbotsford remains today as one of the most famous houses in the world; it reflects, almost as no other place, the mind, enthusiasms and preoccupations of the man who built it. The stones of Abbotsford speak eloquently both of triumph and disaster: First of literary and worldly success, then of the fortitude with which adversity was faced and ultimately conquered in Scott's debt-ridden but noble final years.

Day Three:

St Abbs Head Nature Reserve

St Abbs Head Nature Reserve is cared for by the National Trust for Scotland. Your clients can explore this coastal haven for birdwatchers, nature lovers and walkers and see thousands of seabirds and be awed by the dramatic cliffs overlooking crystal-clear waters. Visitors can enjoy the fresh sea air and epic views of this remote and wild cliff-top beauty spot and discover the feathered residents at this 'seabird city' from spectacular vantage points.

Dirleton Castle

Dirleton Castle is a romantic castle often in the forefront of Scottish history since it was built in the 12th century. The renowned gardens include an Arts and Crafts herbaceous border and Victorian garden. This magnificent fortress-residence served three successive noble families over 400 years. Badly damaged in Cromwell's 1650 siege, Dirleton's fortunes were revived by its new owners in the 1660s.

Tantallon Castle

Set on the edge of the cliffs, looking out to the Bass Rock, this formidable castle was a stronghold of the Douglas family. It was besieged by both James IV and James V but was ultimately destroyed by Oliver Cromwell's troops in a siege of 1651. Many artefacts are displayed to help tell its dramatic stories.

Gosford House

Gosford House, an imposing neo-classical mansion which was one of the last great architectural commissions of the celebrated Scots architect, Robert Adam. Constructed for the seventh Earl of Wemyss, the building was completed in 1800 – eight years after the **architect's death** – and is recognised as an outstanding example of the later period of his work. Your clients can enjoy a private tour of Gosford House highlighting the history of the place, the architecture and the family who live here.
