Peterhead Prison Museum

The Museum is dedicated to the staff that worked in Peterhead Prison between 1888- 2013. Set within the granite prison walls you will experience how life was as an officer serving at Peterhead. Walk through time from 1888 when it first opened its doors to 2013 when it closed and witness how life was for staff serving in this prison. Hear some staff members speak of their experiences as you make your way through the halls, reception, shower block, court room segregation wing, silent cell and hospital. Your clients will sense the tension of daily work within the red granite buildings and try to imagine how it would have felt working in this environment daily.

DogTap Brewdog

Located on a green field site in Ellon, north of Aberdeen, is our state-of-the-art brewery. One of the most technologically advanced in the world, from here we strive constantly to challenge people's preconceptions about what beer is and how it can taste. Ellon is also home to our Overworks Brewery - dedicated to sour beer - and the DogTap tap room, serving up the freshest beer straight from the brewery. With ten taps, the onsite bar opened in 2014, and sits in the shadow of the giant external fermenters, separated from the brew kit by a single glass door.

Fyvie Castle

Cared for by the National Trust for Scotland, a magnificent fortress in the heart of Aberdeenshire, Fyvie Castle's 800-year history is rich in legends, folklore and even ghost stories. Your clients will discover the amazing collection of antiquities, armour and lavish oil paintings, stroll around the picturesque loch or visit the restored glass-roofed racquets court and icehouse. Visitors can lose themselves in the glory of Fyvie's landscape and the richness of its past. Ghosts, legends and folklore are all woven into the tapestry of Fyvie's 800-year-old history. Outside, the 18th-century walled garden has been redeveloped as a garden of Scottish fruits and vegetables. Fyvie Loch is a picturesque landscape feature which supports large numbers of wildfowl.

This small granite distillery takes its name from the valley of the Garioch, traditionally the finest growing barley area of Scotland. For over 200 years, Glen Garioch Distillery has been handcrafting a beautiful range of single malt scotch whiskies which have won highly acclaimed awards at international competitions across the world.

Dunnottar Castle

Dunottar Castle is a romantic, evocative and historically significant ruined Castle perched on a giant conglomerate on the edge of the North-Sea. Visiting Dunnottar Castle, your clients will have an unforgettable experience and will also discover the importance of Dunnottar – an impregnable fortress that holds many rich secrets of Scotland's colourful past. The dramatic and evocative ruined cliff top fortress was the home of the Earls Marischal, once one of the most powerful families in the land. William Wallace, Mary Queen of Scots, the Marquis of Montrose and the future King Charles II have graced the Castle with their presence. Most famously though, it was at Dunnottar Castle that a small garrison held out against the might of Cromwell's army for eight months and saved the Scottish Crown Jewels, the 'Honours of Scotland', from destruction.
