Dirleton Castle

Dirleton Castle is one of Scotland's oldest surviving strongholds. It was built on a naturally rocky outcrop, on a low ridge overlooking the farmland of East Lothian. They can also admire this 13th-century fortress which was a magnificent fortified residence to three successive noble families for 400 years and stroll around the impressive gardens.
