The Church of the Holy Rude

Take your clients on a free tour of the Church of the Holy Rude, the second oldest building in Stirling after the castle. It was founded in 1129 during the reign of David I (1124 - 1153) as the parish church of Stirling. Because of its close links with the castle, the church always had the support and patronage of the Stuart kings, especially in the 15th, 16th and early 17th centuries, and is the only church in the United Kingdom other than Westminster Abbey to have held a coronation and still be a living church today.

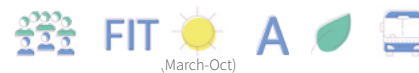

Doune Castle

Your clients will explore this 14th century courtyard castle in Doune, with a striking 100 ft high gatehouse and one of the best-preserved great halls in Scotland. The castle has also been made famous on the large and small screens having featured in such varied productions as Ivanhoe, Monty Python and the Holy Grail, as Winterfell in the Games of Thrones pilot, and as Castle Leoch in Outlander.

Dunblane Cathedral

Dunblane Cathedral is a beautiful medieval church dating back to the 12th-century. The stunning Gothic exterior, conserved by a 19th-century restoration, hides a past of neglect and renewal. Your clients can explore Dunblane Cathedral for free, gaze up at the four-storey red sandstone tower – the oldest part of the church, see the weathered interior walls of the nave, which had no roof for 300 years and walk among the choir stalls dating from the 1400s, some of the finest of their type in Scotland.

Dollar Glen

Lying above the town of Dollar in Clackmannanshire, Dollar Glen offers your clients exhilarating walks, deep gorges, cascading waterfalls and an abundance of plants and wildlife. Castle Campbell

Formerly known as the Castle of Grooms, the 15th-century fortress of Castle Campbell is dramatically situated above Dollar Glen. The oldest part is a well-preserved 15th-century tower around which other buildings were constructed, including an unusual loggia. Your clients can explore Castle Campbell's visitor centre, cobbled courtyard and interpretation displays. What was once the ideal situation for the lowland stronghold of a powerful clan can today be an idyllic setting for wedding ceremonies between the months of April and October.
