Falkland Palace

Falkland Palace was the favourite retreat of the Stuart dynasty, especially Mary Queen of Scots who visited for the hunting, hawking and tennis. The Palace which sits in nine acres of beautifully maintained grounds provides a unique opportunity to explore the magnificent Chapel Royal and fascinating 17th-century artefacts. The tranquil grounds are home to the world's oldest surviving real tennis court. The village of Falkland also featured as a location in the Outlander TV series.

Arbroath Abbey

Arbroath Abbey is famously associated with the Declaration of Arbroath, which asserted Scotland's independence from England in 1320. Parts of the abbey church and domestic buildings remain, notably the gatehouse range and the abbot's house. Your clients can explore the substantial ruins of a Tironensian monastery, founded by William the Lion in 1178. Visitors can also enjoy the herb garden along the south wall of the abbey church. The visitor centre provides a walk-through audio-visual with a sound loop system.

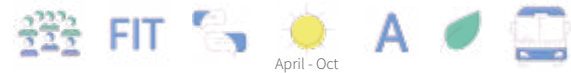
Glamis Castle

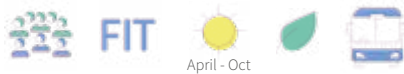
Stanley Mills
