## Museum of Lead Mining

The Museum tells the story of how lead ore or 'galena' was extracted and the processes it went through to become the lead products that we know today. Your clients will discover the 18th-century lead mine where they will experience the thrill of going on the only underground gold mine tour in Scotland. They can take a glimpse into the past by visiting the miners' cottages and see how the miners and their families lived during the periods of 1750, 1850 & 1910.

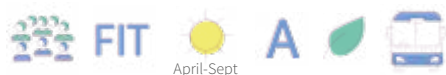
## Drumlanrig Castle

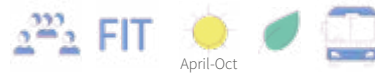
## Threave Castle

Cared for by Historic Environment Scotland, this massive tower house was built in the late 14th-century by Archibald the Grim, Lord of Galloway as a stronghold for the Black Douglases. Situated on an island in the middle of the River Dee, this formidable castle is only reachable by boat. Your clients will begin their journey to the castle at Kelton Mains farm and from there follow the picturesque 10-minute walk through fields and past woods until they find a small jetty.

## Mull of Galloway Lighthouse

The Mull of Galloway Lighthouse is perched on the edge of a 260 ft. high cliff at Scotland's most southerly point. It was built by Robert Stevenson, with work taking two years to complete. The light, which stands 99 m above sea level, was first lit on the 26th March 1830 and it remains operational today. Your clients can climb the 115 steps to the top of the Lighthouse and enjoy spectacular views of Cumbria, Isle of Man and Ireland.

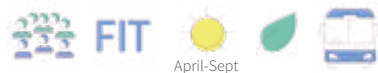
### Cardoness Castle

A fine example of a Scottish tower-house castle, Cardoness was built in the later 15th-century as the fortified residence of the McCullochs. This castle is a well-preserved ruin where your clients can admire the exquisite architectural detail of this still magnificent structure, including the splendid fireplace and wall-cupboard where the family's best silverware was displayed. Visitors can touch the intricate stone carvings and soak up the superb views over the beautiful Fleet Bay to the Solway Firth beyond.

## Sweetheart Abbey

The romantic abbey is enclosed by an impressive precinct wall of massive granite boulders. Your clients will discover this splendid red-sandstone ruin, founded by Lady Dervorguilla, in memory of her husband Lord John Balliol. When her husband died in 1268, Lady Dervorguilla had his heart embalmed and placed in an ivory casket which she carried everywhere with her. On her death, she was laid to rest with her husband's heart and the monks named the abbey in memory of her.

## Caerlaverock Castle

With its moat, twin towered gatehouse and imposing battlements, this awe-inspiring castle is the epitome of the medieval stronghold and one of the finest castles in Scotland.
