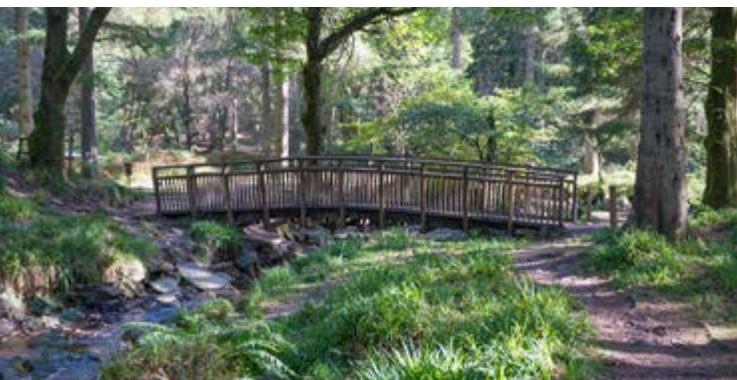

Moirlanich Longhouse

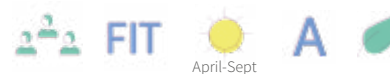
