Spynie Palace

Located near the historic town of Elgin, Spynie Palace has been the residence of the bishops of Moray for 500 years. Gordon Castle Walled Garden

A hidden gem situated between the River Spey and the Moray Coast, Gordon Castle's Walled Garden is one of Scotland's best kept secrets.
