Paxton House

Paxton House is a true Borders hidden gem. A fine example of Neo-Palladian architecture, it was completed in 1763 with the primary aim of impressing a Prussian bride. Sadly, the star-crossed lovers never married or lived in the house. Visitors are guided through eight generations of family history including a rags to riches story, travels in America and the Caribbean to fortunes being made in sugar cane fuelled by the slave trade.
