The Blackhouse, Arnol

The Blackhouse at Arnol is a traditional Lewis thatched house built around 1880 and gives visitors a special and authentic insight into island life. It was once the residence of a Hebridean crafting family and is preserved today almost as its last inhabitant left it, complete with a peat fire and open hearth. A furnished 1920s croft house is also open to view.

The Calanais Standing Stones

Located in the west coast of Lewis, the 5,000 year old Callanish Stones are famous all over the world.
