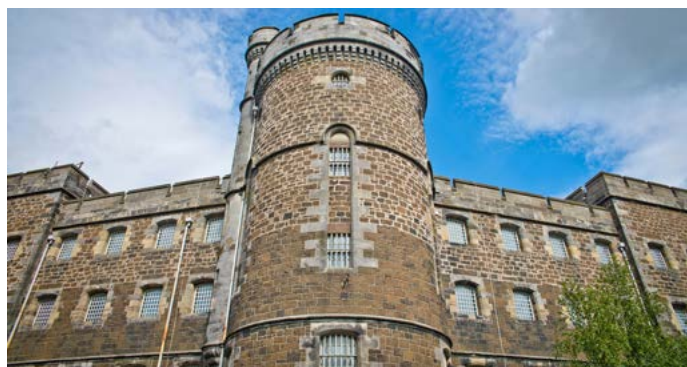

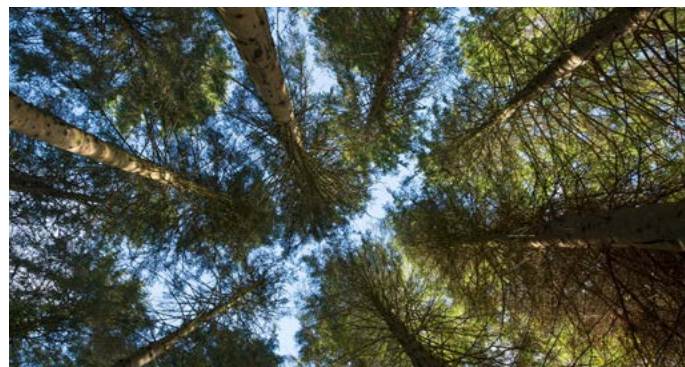

At the visitor centre you can learn the story of the village while nearby is the Falls of Clyde wildlife reserve with its peregrine falcons and waterfalls.
