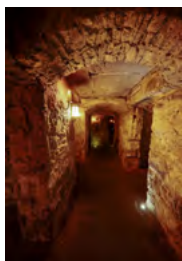

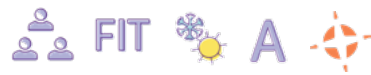

Outside of the castle you can follow the Macbeth Sculpture trail carved from trees grown on the estate and see a variety of flora and fauna, including Red Squirrels and Highland Cattle.

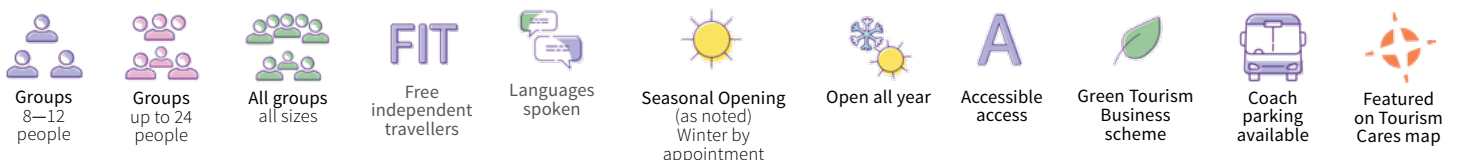
Murton Trust for Education and the Environment
