Carnegie left a legacy which continues today, as his birthplace cottage testifies he came from humble beginnings. Adjacent to the cottage is the Art Deco style museum hall, built by his widow Louise Carnegie in 1928. Explore the cottage and follow the family's journey to America where he made his fortune. Discover why he became known as the father of philanthropy.

Dunfermline Abbey

Dunfermline Abbey has a special place in the nation's heart. Laid to rest in the abbey are some of Scotland's great kings and queens – including Robert the Bruce. The abbey's great nave is the most visually stunning example of Romanesque architecture in Scotland. Dunfermline's story stretches back to the 11th century – the time of Malcolm III and his queen, Margaret. 




Peterhead Prison Museum
