Nearby is a small hill known as 'Macbeth's Hillock' where the Shakespearean hero is said to have encountered the Three Witches.

Spynie Palace

Located near the historic town of Elgin, this has been the residence of the Bishops of Moray for 500 years. Your clients can enter the largest surviving medieval Bishop’s house in Scotland where Royalty travelling in the area sometimes stayed. The surrounding Spynie countryside has stunning views and beautiful wildlife. Your clients can also walk to the site of the old cathedral and see the final resting place of James Ramsay MacDonald, Labour’s first Prime Minister. Elgin Cathedral

Nicknamed “The Lantern of the North”, Elgin Cathedral is one of the most beautiful historic ruins in Scotland. Elgin Cathedral has a rich history - it was badly fire damaged in 1390 following an attack by Alexander Stewart, who was also known as the ‘Wolf of Badenoch’. The top of the tower has an open viewing platform with great views over Elgin. Your clients can enjoy the cathedral’s carved stones in a new exhibition in the cathedral towers. WDC Scottish Dolphin Centre

This is a unique and educational attraction based in the fishing village of Spey Bay. The Moray Firth is home to a population of around 190 of the largest and most northerly bottlenose dolphins in the world. The area’s wildlife also includes seabirds, otters, ospreys, seals, basking sharks and minke whales. At the Dolphin Centre your clients can enter for free and hear how the Conservation Charity works to protect whales and dolphins in Scotland, and across the globe.

### Gordon Castle Walled Garden

A hidden gem situated between the River Spey and the Moray Coast, Gordon Castle's Walled Garden is one of Scotland's best kept secrets. At almost eight acres in size, it is one of the oldest and largest kitchen gardens in Britain and has been lovingly restored to its former glory by designer Arne Maynard. Your clients can relax in the peaceful surroundings and see a dedicated team of gardeners at work. They can also try delicious, freshly picked produce in their café.

### Balvenie Castle

Built in the 1200s as the seat of the powerful Earls of Buchan, this heavily fortified stronghold became an elegant lodging in the 1500s. A wide ditch encircles this striking, curtain-walled castle. Once conquered by the legendary Robert the Bruce, your clients can now admire the unique blend of medieval and renaissance architecture. The Atholl Lodging within the castle is another fine example of Renaissance architecture, showing the layout of a noble residence and containing some fine details. ### Cardhu Distillery

Founded by Helen Cummings in 1811 as an illicit distillery and licensed in 1824, this is the first distillery to be officially pioneered by a woman. Your clients can discover the history of Cardhu, the 1st distillery to partner with John Walker & Sons, on a guided tour, browse the gift shop or relax with a dram of the famous single malt. It is produced in limited quantities by a deliberately slow distillation process and matured for 12 years in specially selected oak casks. Your clients will enjoy Cardhu's exceptionally smooth and mellow character. Partially accessible - please contact for full details.
