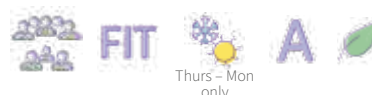


Perth Art Gallery

V&A Dundee

Scotland's 1st design museum and the 1st V&A to open outside of London. The Scottish Design Gallery, featuring Charles Rennie Mackintosh's Oak Room, is the museum's permanent collection, but throughout the year there are many changing exhibitions so your clients can experience the remarkable story of design both past and present not only from Scotland but from all around the world. Enjoy the stunning views across the river Tay on the outdoor terrace or sit inside the building and soak up the impressive architecture of this unique building designed by Kengo Kuma. Coach drop off only. Closed Tuesdays in winter.

Discovery Point

Discovery Point is home to the Royal Research Ship Discovery, which was built in the city in 1901. Your clients can tour the museum to discover all about the construction of the ship and about the voyage to the Antarctic from start to finish, brought to life along the way by video. Enjoy the new Dome Experience where you can view Dundee as it was in 1901 in a 360-view & audio-visual experience overlooking Dundee and the River Tay. Your clients can then follow in the footsteps of Captain Robert Falcon Scott and Sir Ernest Shackleton and go on board the ship and explore all decks.
