# The Church of the Holy Rude

Take your clients on a free tour of the second oldest building in Stirling after the castle. It was founded in 1129 during the reign of David I (1124 - 1153) as the parish church of Stirling. Due to its close links with the castle, the church always had the support and patronage of the Stuart Kings, especially in the 15th, 16th and early 17th centuries, and is the only church in the United Kingdom other than Westminster Abbey to have held a coronation and still be a living church today.

Dunblane Cathedral is a beautiful medieval church dating back to the 12th-century. The stunning Gothic exterior, conserved by a 19th century restoration, hides a past of neglect and renewal.
