

Preston Mill and Phantassie Doocot

This picturesque 18th century water mill in an idyllic East Lothian location might make your clients think they've wound up somewhere in a story book. Cared for by the National Trust for Scotland, this property is an architectural oddity which was also featured in season one of the world-renowned TV series Outlander. Your clients can tour the mill to see and hear the mechanisms in action, learn more about the millers who worked there and enjoy the peaceful surroundings. Open Thurs-Mon. Partially accessible.

Tantallon Castle

Set on the edge of the cliffs by the sea just along the coast from North Berwick, Tantallon Castle is one of Scotland's last medieval castles. Your clients can view artefacts and imagine the clashes with the Crown whilst listening to stories of ghost sightings within the thick walls that stood strong until a siege by Oliver Cromwell's army. With spectacular views across to the Bass Rock they might even be lucky enough to watch gannets plunging into the North Sea. Partially accessible.

Dirleton Castle

Dirleton Castle is one of Scotland's oldest surviving strongholds. It was built on a naturally rocky outcrop, on a low ridge overlooking the farmland of East Lothian. Your clients can learn about how the castle was damaged and taken on two occasions by the English during the Scottish Wars of Independence. They can also admire this 13th-century fortress which was a magnificent fortified residence to three successive noble families for 400 years and stroll around the impressive gardens. Partially accessible. Closed Thurs/Fri in winter.

Built in the 15th century and massively strengthened in the 16th century as an artillery fortress, Blackness Castle has been a royal castle, prison, armaments depot and film location for several films and television series such as Outlaw King and Outlander. This castle's fortifications make it look like a ship that never sailed. Your clients can explore what was one of the most advanced fortifications of its time whilst taking in impressive views of the Forth and its three bridges.

Linlithgow Palace

Linlithgow Palace is a magnificent ruin set within its own park and was a favoured residence of the Stewart Kings and Queens from James I (1406-37) onward. Your clients will be able to see where King James V (1512) and Mary Queen of Scots (1542) were both born. Its high towers look out over lush greenery and a loch brimming with wildfowl. The palace was also used in more recent times as a filming location for the television series Outlander. Partially accessible.

Cairnpapple Hill

Your clients can explore a rare ceremonial complex in the Bathgate Hills. The broad summit of Cairnpapple Hill was a significant site for ceremonies and burials for at least 4,000 years, and in its day would have been comparable to better known sites like the Standing Stones of Stenness. Your clients will discover its henge, which dates from about 3800BC. On a clear day, they might even be able to spot Goat Fell, the highest peak on the Isle of Arran.
