Designed by internationally acclaimed Japanese architect Kengo Kuma, the first V&A museum in the world outside London and the first ever dedicated design museum in Scotland. V&A Dundee welcomes your clients to the world of design and encourages them to explore how design creativity can be provocative, ingenious or simply breathtaking. Your clients can experience the remarkable story of design past, present and future and the vital contribution design makes to everybody's life, through permanent displays and changing exhibitions. RRS Discovery



Discovery Point is a 5 star attraction and home to the World Heritage Asset Royal Research Ship Discovery. Discovery was built in Dundee in 1901 for scientific purposes to explore the Antarctic. Today your clients can follow in the footsteps of Captain Robert Falcon Scott, Sir Ernest Shackleton and crew and climb aboard the ship and see where they ate, slept and spent 2 long winters exploring the Antarctic. Enjoy the latest addition to the museum, Discovery Dome, where you are transported back to 1901 by an immersive 360 degree view and audio visual experience overseeing Dundee and the River Tay as it was when the ship was built.

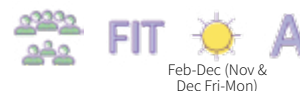

Arbroath Abbey

Famously associated with the Declaration of Arbroath of 1320, which asserted Scotland's independence from England and proclaimed Robert the Bruce as King of Scotland. A facsimile of this iconic document is on display at their visitor centre. Your clients can explore the substantial ruins of this Tironensian monastery, founded in 1178 by William the Lion, who is also buried here, and enjoy the herb garden along the south wall of the abbey church. Parts of the Abbey remain closed due to high level masonry works. Closed Tues/Wed in winter. Partially accessible.

St Vigeans Sculptured Stones and Museum

St Vigeans was likely an important Pictish religious centre, judging by the number and quality of the Pictish Christian carvings. The carved stones were dotted in and around the village church, which sits on a natural mound where a Pictish church or monastery may have once stood. Some stones were even incorporated into the walls of the late medieval church and a few remained in place. Your clients can also look for the Latin, Pictish and Old Irish words on the Drosten Stone.

Cared for by the National Trust for Scotland, your clients can explore the birthplace and childhood home of Peter Pan creator, J M Barrie, and see how his early life inspired his work. Your clients can visit the exhibition, complete with original theatrical costumes and manuscripts and learn about Barrie's life and his enduring connection with Kirriemuir. An exhibition tells the story of his life and work and includes the writing desk from Barrie's London flat where he wrote Peter Pan.

Glamis Castle

A tour of Glamis Castle is a journey through Scotland's heritage and historical significance. Highlights of the tour include the Royal Apartments where HM Queen Elizabeth The Late Queen Mother spent her honeymoon and the Late HRH Princess Margaret was born and Duncan's Hall, which commemorates the slaying of King Duncan by Macbeth. Your clients will also have the opportunity to follow the Macbeth sculpture trail carved from trees grown on the estate, and see a variety of flora and fauna, including red squirrels and Highland cattle. 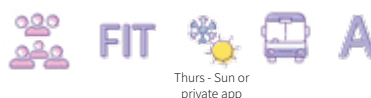
The Bothy Experience
