Barry Mill

Now a haven of tranquillity, Barry Mill is one of only a handful of mills still powered by water. Rebuilt after a fire around 1814, it is probably the largest and finest example of its type still in operation. Your clients can hear the splash of the waterwheel at this 19th century mill, the rumble of milling machinery, and the smell of grinding corn as the process of milling grain into oatmeal in the traditional manner is explained.
