Huntly Castle

The castle has a storied past including numerous Royal visits, battles and executions. Balmoral Castle

The Scottish home of the Royal Family since it was purchased for Queen Victoria by Prince Albert in 1852 and much loved by the Late Queen Elizabeth II and where she spent her final days. The grounds, exhibitions and Ballroom are open to visitors seasonally in the Spring/Summer and closed when the Royal Family are in residence. 
