Located in a spectacular Edwardian building in the centre of Perth, hear the stories that put the City at the heart of Scotland's History. Branklyn Gardens

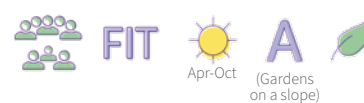

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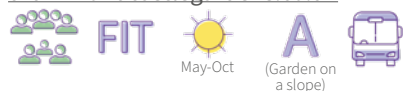

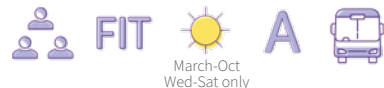
The Library of Innerpeffray
