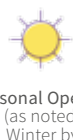

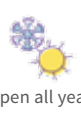

Designed by Sir Robert Lorimer and built between 1904 and 1908 for the Sharp family, the mansion remains largely unchanged from its original design, showcasing an exceptional collection of fine art, tapestries and ceramics. The surrounding grounds, also created by Lorimer, feature formal lawns, yew hedging, flowering borders and a sunken rose garden, while the estate's unique nine-hole hickory golf course highlights the family's passion for the sport. 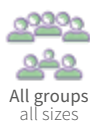

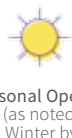

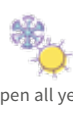
